The Sanitary Sewer System **A Shared Responsibility**

We all have a role in keeping our community's sewer system functioning properly. MUPB safeguards its own mains and laterals; while the private laterals (as shown below) are the responsibility of the property owner. Maintenance of your sewer lateral is critical to prevent sewage "backups" on your property or in your home. Damage caused by sewage backup can be expensive (thousands of dollars) and this cost is not always covered by homeowners or MUPB insurance policies. If you own or are purchasing a home, please be aware that some connections, especially floor drains below surrounding ground levels, may be considered a "prohibited connection" to the sewer system. These connections must be disconnected upon discovery according to the Sewer Use Ordinance (see QR Code below).

Managing a Sewer Backup

- Feminine Hygiene Needles Products




Kitchen

NOTE: If the MUPB sewer lines are determined to be clear by our crews during a sewer backup event, it is the responsibility of the property owner to call a licensed plumber or drain service to correct the problem. We cannot recommend any plumber. MUPB will not reimburse you, a plumber, drain service, etc. for work rendered confirming that the problem was not in your sewer lateral but in the MUPB lines.
